On audition day, be on time. Please arrive $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before your appointment.

Confidence in your art is best demonstrated by being well prepared. Do not wait until the last minute to select and rehearse your material. Rehearse all audition materials thoroughly. Do not try to "wing it." Those who are not prepared (not to be confused with those who are nervous) will be sent home. Please wear appropriate clothing for the department you are auditioning for.

DISCIPLINE	BE PREPARED TO:					
Acting	Perform two one-minute memorized monologues: one comedy and one drama. It is advisable that one monologue is a character close to you in terms of age and personality. The other monologue should show your range in terms of playing a challenging character. Monologues should be from published works. Adult language, adult content, and original material are unacceptable. Selecting the best monologues for you is very important. Monologues from a play are much better material than a stand-alone monologue from a monologue book. There is a whole story to the play and the monologue shows dramatic development. - Introduce each monologue by the name of the play, the author, and the character you are performing. Do not give background on the character or explain the scene. - Since very few roles in plays are teenage characters, we strongly suggest that you dress in professional audition attire: NO jeans, t-shirts, or sneakers. We are looking to see if you can create a character and establish the mood and tempo of the piece. Suggested Sources: the internet or your local bookstore. Look for play scripts or monologue books.					
Dance	Prior technical training required. - Learn a ballet barre, jazz progression, modern combination, and tap sequence on site. Attire: Dark leotard, pink or black tights, hair back. Bring jazz shoes and ballet slippers. Tap shoes optional.					
Orchestra (Traditional Music Program)	Play 1-2 short selections (3 minute max.) which best demonstrate your musical and technical ability. Expect a short excerpt to sight-read. - Play scales from memory as follows (two octaves when possible): wind instruments: B-flat, E-flat, A-flat, F, C, chromatic (from your lowest note to highest note - show your range) string instruments: C, G, D, A, F, chromatic (from your lowest note to highest note - show your range) piano: F, C, G (2 hands), 2 octave chromatic C-C guitar, drum set: demonstrate the following styles - swing, rock, Latin concert percussion (in addition to 1-2 short selections: keyboard marimba, bells, etc.): C, B-flat, E-flat scales, concert snare drum-roll soft to loud to soft. - Bring your instrument and sheet music. A piano, all percussion, and guitar amp are available.					
Musical Theatre	Sing: Submit a video of 32 bars of an up-tempo Broadway Standard and 16 bars of a contemporary Broadway Ballad. Submissions may be with a track or with an accompanist. Videos should be uploaded to a platform such as YouTube or Vimeo. Email video links to APAMTDEPT@gmail.com . Subject line should read: MT Audition. Please bring sheet music (in the correct key) for the above submissions with you to your audition. Dance: Learn and perform a short show dance combination. Act: Perform one memorized monologue from a Broadway musical. Make sure you know the musical it is from and the character you are performing. Attire: jazz pants or character skirt; jazz shoes or character shoes.					

Music Media & Be prepared to perform an original, contemporary, or classic rock song. Those who play an instrument as **Entertainment** well as sing are encouraged to audition doing both at the same time during their vocal audition. Technology - Stage presence, attitude, and knowledge of the material are crucial to performance and will be taken into (Popular Music) consideration as part of your audition. - Musical pieces may be up to 2 minutes max. Please be advised that those auditioning may only be asked to perform a verse and a chorus, but should also be prepared to perform the entire song. VOCALISTS: (PART 1) All vocalists will be brought into the MMET studio for ear testing as a group. (PART 2) Be prepared to sing a pop or rock song of your choice. You will not be permitted to sing acapella. (PART 3) Vocalists are also required to learn one song from the list below. Be prepared to sing one verse and one chorus: Upper Voices (typically female) Poor Poor Pitiful Me - Linda Ronstadt Back In My Arms Again - The Supremes Love Will Keep Us Together - Captain & Tennille Lower Voices (typically male) I Will Follow You Into the Dark - Death Cab for Cutie I'm a Believer - The Monkees You've Got a Friend - James Taylor **INSTRUMENTALISTS:** Bring your guitar or bass. DO NOT BRING your keyboard, drum set, pedal boards, or amps (these are provided). Know how to plug into an amp and tune your instrument. (PART 1) Be prepared to jam on a I-IV-V blues progression in D and E keys and play with a staff member. This applies to keyboard, bass guitar, and electric guitar. (PART 2) Be prepared to play a popular rock or pop song of your choice. The instructors need to hear a verse and a chorus. If you have a recording you need to play along with, bring the recording on a device and headphones. (PART 3) Bass Players: Riffs #1-10 (From "100 Bass Riffs" on YouTube). Do not learn the whole song, only the riffs from YouTube video (www.youtube.com/watch?v=T-RjmUFec40) **You will not have to play the medley in time, you just need to play each riff (#1-10). Guitarists: Riffs #1-12 (From "100 Riffs: A Brief History of Rock N Roll"). Do not learn the whole song, only the riffs from the YouTube video (www.youtube.com/watch?v=xiC ljCa2s) **You will not have to play the medley in time, you just need to play each riff (#1-12). Drums: Choose TWO from the following songs and learn the intro, verse, and first chorus: September - Earth, Wind & Fire Queens of the Stone Age - No One Knows Jimmy Eat World - The Middle Keys: Choose TWO from the following songs and learn the intro, verse, and first chorus: Don't Stop Me Now - Queen Natural Woman - Aretha Franklin For Once in My life - Stevie Wonder All students will be interviewed by Mr. Simmons and Mrs. Collins, and are to produce and submit a 3 Music Media & minute (max.) video about themselves. **Entertainment** There are no more specific instructions beyond the video's time limit; however, the way this simple challenge is Technology approached should tell us what we need to know about the student's creativity, skills, and personality. Do you really want (Media) to be a part of the team? Your video should convince us! - Videos should be uploaded to a platform such as YouTube or Google Drive. Email video links to Mr. Simmons at msimmons@hbuhsd.edu no later than Feb 14, 2020. Dramatic Presentation of a portfolio – if available. **Production** Playwrights: Bring writing samples of plays, short stories, poems, etc. Directors: There will be a short interview in which you will talk about your leadership potential and creative ideas. Technical Interview with Mr. Batte.

Theatre Presentation of portfolio or samples – if available (lighting, sound, scenic design, construction, and stage management). Please be prepared to answer this question: "Why do you want to be a member of the APA Technical Theatre Department?" Costume Design

Interview with Ms. Perez and résumé of skills.

Presentation of portfolio or samples - if available. Please be prepared to answer this question: "Why do you want to be a member of the APA Costume Design Department?"
